The DBE's position

- The Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) wants to ensure a sustainable future of all of its Church schools and will support school leaders and governing bodies with making well informed, strategic decisions about the future of your Church school
- The DBE is committed to supporting the growth and development of all Church Multi-Academy Trusts within the
 Diocese of Guildford so that there is enough capacity in the academy sector for every Church school to become an
 academy
- Working in joint partnership with our Church MATs and our governing bodies, the DBE's ambition is to ensure that
 every Church school can join a Church MAT which will safeguard its future and protect, maintain and develop its
 Christian character
- The DBE expects that by 2030, the majority of our Church schools will have joined a Church MAT or have plans in place to become an academy





Current position for Church Schools

New Church of England Articles of Association for Church Multi-Academy
 Trusts which allow VA, VC and Community schools to join the same trust

- The Alliance Multi-Academy Trust (TAMAT), The Prospect Trust and the Newark Trust will be adopting these new Articles going forward which provides greater capacity for VA schools who want to academise
- The Newark Trust will be re-purposed and become the 'Learning Partners'
 Church Academy Trust' (LPCAT). It will continue to be a Church of England
 MAT which will take Church schools across the Diocese





Diocesan Academy Strategy

- Under the national MOU between the DFE and the Church of England, every Diocese is required to publish a Diocesan Academy Strategy
- The DBE is currently revising its academy strategy, working with the 5 Church MATs to agree a Diocesan MOU which will set out the agreed principles, protocols and criteria that the DBE will use to give consent for future academy conversions – this will be published at the beginning of the summer term
- Governing bodies need to read the new DBE criteria which sets out the conditions for future Church school academy conversions

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the DBE and our Church MATs

Principles, Protocols & Criteria



Key Principles

- We will always make our decisions with the best interests of children at heart
- We will work together, listening and consulting with all parties before taking decisions
- We are committed to seeing every Church and Church/Community MAT in the diocese grow and develop and where necessary, merge with another MAT to achieve long term sustainability
- We are prepared to take difficult decisions and model courageous leadership in the sector
- We will work together to seek an equitable distribution of Church schools across our Church MATs
- We are committed to open and transparent communication with our family of Church schools and each other
- We will support school leaders and governors to make good strategic decisions which is in the best interest of their school and their pupils
- We will promote the Church of England vision for education and the Diocesan academy strategy





Key Protocols (1)

- The Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) is the statutory body and religious authority for all Church schools in the Diocese; its consent is required for a Church school to become an academy
- The Regional Director (RD) is required to consult with the DBE on seeking to find a Church MAT* which is suitable for a Church school seeking to become an academy or directed to become an academy
- The DBE will engage with all Church MATs to determine the best solution for a Church school and will use the academy criteria published in the Diocesan academy strategy before giving its conditional consent
- Church MATs will work in partnership with the DBE in the spirit of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to agree a suitable solution for a Church school



Key Protocols (2)

- The DDE and Church MAT CEOs will meet together to discuss the difficult cases seeking to identify a Church MAT for a Church school in line with the key principles in the MOU
- Governing Bodies of Local Authority maintained Church schools are the legally responsible body for their schools; the DBE does not have power to direct schools to become academies but will use its influence to shape the direction in line with the Diocesan academy strategy
- In the event that a Church school is considered vulnerable to closure, the DBE will work with the Local Authority to seek a solution for the school and will not expect a Church MAT to take a Church school which is not financially viable in the long term



Decision-Making Criteria

- 1. Commitment to the Christian character of the Church school & the legal protections
- 2. Geography and travel required between schools (including existing federations and partnerships)
- 3. The pupil journey and transition between infant, junior, primary and secondary schools, sixth form
- 4. School improvement capability and expertise
- 5. Trust capacity and existing academy conversions already underway
- 6. Distribution and type of schools already in the MAT
- 7. Trust Specialisms
- 8. Other factors which are bespoke/specific to the school's context
