School and Church Partnerships Audit Tool: Diocese of Guildford

Both the school and the parish church seek to serve the community in which they are located. The school community includes more than children and teachers; including households, extended family, support staff and premises staff who often live close to the school. The relationship between the school and the parish church can be a mutually beneficial for children and adults.

This audit tool offers an opportunity to review this joint working, celebrate successes and agree areas for development and maybe things to stop doing! This tool is for both church schools and non-church schools, we have made clear which actions apply only to church schools by shading the boxes.

We suggest that one person from the school and one person from the church look at this tool together, perhaps considering one or two sections at a time. This is for you to use and adapt to suit your local context.
