Background

The Schools Officer for Christian Distinctiveness is the lead officer responsible for working and supporting the Christian character of the 83 Church of England schools in the Diocese of Guildford.

Job Purpose

The key purpose of the role is support Church schools with developing their theologically rooted vision and to help school leaders with developing the Christian ethos of their schools. This includes delivering training to school leaders, governors and R.E. Subject Leaders and Collective Worship leaders.

Responsibilities

The Schools Officer Christian Distinctiveness is responsible for the following key areas:

- Provide high quality training for teachers and governors on R.E., Collective Worship, Spiritual and Moral Development and the Christian leadership of schools
- Contribute to the development of the Christian distinctiveness of Church of England schools and academies within the Diocese of Guildford
- Work closely with the SIAMS officer in the Education team and keeping abreast of developments in the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) liaise with the R.E. adviser
- Liaise with the School Church Partnerships Adviser to encourage schools to work in partnership with their local churches
- Build and develop a supportive network through school visits and one-to-one meetings
- Liaise with the Diocesan R.E. Adviser and the SACRE Adviser to keep abreast of diocesan and SACRE initiatives
- Liaise with other R.E. Advisers nationally, in other dioceses and in our Local Authorities to keep abreast of national developments
- Serve as the lead officer for the DBE's Christian Distinctiveness Committee
- Organise and support events for Church schools

General

- Serve as part of the Education team and support the work of the Diocesan Board of Education, attending Board and Committee meetings when requested
- Carry out duties in line with DBF's policies and procedures, including safeguarding, data protection, health and safety and equal opportunities.
